BRIEFING NOTICE

The Commission requests that the parties brief the issues raised in the Secretary's petition for discretionary review and the Respondent's conditional petition for discretionary review. The parties are advised that when the merits or characterization of an item is before the Commission for review, the appropriateness of the penalty is also subject to review. Accordingly, the parties may address the amount of the penalty if they so choose.

All briefs are to be filed in accordance with Commission Rule 93.¹ The first brief is to be filed within 40 days of this notice. A party who does not intend to file a brief is asked to notify the Commission of its intent in writing within the applicable time for filing briefs and serve a copy on all other parties. The time for filing briefs (or similar notices of intent) of opposing parties shall commence on the date of service.
